Introduction

David Lloyd has been developing his skills as a painter of buildings and associated scenes over the past ten years and has successfully built up his reputation with both corporate and private collectors.

In 1995 and again in 1996 he held successful one-man exhibitions in Highgate and in 1997 in Burgh House, Hampstead. Previous exhibitions included the Law Society in 1994 and another at the Middle Temple Library. In 1998 he exhibited at the Inner Temple and was commissioned to paint five views within the Temple for postcards. David Lloyd has travelled extensively during the past few years, visiting India, Australia and Europe accompanied by his sketchbook, giving added colour and verve to his paintings.
