Introduction Philip Harris is probably best known for his painting 'Two Figures Lying in a Stream', winner of the 1993 BP Portrait Award. He has received significant critical acclaim for his figurative work, whilst being compared to artists from Degas to Lucian Freud, Harris's work is rendered with a hyper-real exactness reminiscent of Millais immaculate 'Ophelia'. The National Portrait Gallery and the New York Metropolitan Museum of Art have bought his work and he continues to exhibit extensively across London.
